Lead Pastor Report

Thank you for an amazing year of life together, for adventures shared with Jesus. I continue to enjoy post-sermon conversations. These verify you are listening, as well as help me know what I need to say or do going forward. That you come along with me means I sometimes get it right, catching what you need and how to provide it.

I love when you step up and lead or serve, using the gifts God has given to you for his Church. This is part of what church life is all about. We are indeed growing and becoming more together.

Church Family Life

I am truly thankful for each one of you. You reveal more of God as we walk with Jesus. From your faithful attention to the needs of those around you to your laughter in the lobby, from your willingness to roll up your sleeves and wash dishes to your generous gifts for the community, from your worship giving to your "faithful doing" to make Trinity possible, you inspire greatness in others. You rock!

This past year we donated food and other supplies to "rescue" the hungry and struggling. We paid bills and purchased services to keep people in their homes. We helped the unhoused. We listened to others' stories and attempted to guide and assist them to healthy next steps. And you prayed while all of this was happening.

Together, Going

Our church family and ministry theme, "Together, Going," has been reflected in our programming, as well as in your responses. We talk about going together. - Article XII, Section VI, Point 3 . . . we alphabetized the list of Ministry Teams. It made sense to do so.

Journey 53 Update

About twelve years ago, Trinity Church and the EC Church partnered to launch a new ministry to reach the unchurched and de-churched of the greater Pottstown area. Journey 53, a non-traditional church ministry, has done exactly what they set out to do . . . reach people for Christ and his Church. Rev. Rick Christman continues to lead this ministry. Below is an update report from Rick. I was thrilled to read what Rick wrote. Even more so when we sat while I listened to story after story of life change. I thought you needed to see this as well.

Journey 53 Report

Rick Christmas

Journey 53 is still about three things after all these years: Love God, love others, and serve the world!

In the past twelve years we have encouraged over 275 people to either begin a relationship with God or rekindle a relationship that had been lost. Many of those 275 people have been successfully assimilated into many local churches, and most are involved in ministry and local church leadership; two of those families are in paid ministry positions in their local church. In many of our friend circles, we are the only connection point as followers of Christ that some of them have.

In 2022, we reached the goal of giving 10% of our J53 income away. We were able to bless the Kingdom Outreach (part of the E.C. denomination), two different mission groups, and other families in need across the Boyertown Area.

There are six families that are worshiping with us regularly right now, and we are working on assimilating one of our families back into a local church. We have realized that we are a transitional ministry in which people come to Christ or back to Christ before transitioning to other Christian communities.

There are many personal stories in which we have been able to connect people with God that are too long and too numerous to share. Thanks for praying for us in this work that God has called us to do.

Active Beyond Trinity

I leave my home each day hoping to make a difference, not just here at Trinity, but also in my neighborhood or grocery store. I want my presence to make a difference. Beyond that I try to make full use of my gifts, graces, skills, and experiences to add to the Church. I do that here at Trinity and in other churches and for our denomination.

I also coach and/or train other pastors and church leaders/leadership teams when invited. I am an active member of the annual EC Church's Pastoral Assessment Center in January. Carol usually joins me for that adventure. I am a member of a team of pastors that walks beside struggling churches and helps strengthen their serve. And as a credentialed coach, I coach – individuals (life, grief, self-improvement) and teams (usually church leadership teams). Please pray with me as I try to be a good steward of the spiritual gifts, professional skills, and passions I have been blessed with or acquired.

Carol and I thank you for your love and support, and for your partnership in our corporate Jesus adventures. Thank you also for allowing us to be part of your lives. You have become like family. Thank you for your prayers as we seek to maintain balance in our lives, at home, with you, in our community, and for the larger Kingdom.

Associate Pastor Report Elevate Student Ministry

Theme:

It has been my privilege to serve as the Associate Pastor of Youth and Young Adults here at Trinity this past year. This past year within the student ministry, a prevailing theme has been "a new identity". We had a large and very influential senior class graduate, and a few other teens move away, so our group this past school year has been slowly finding our new identity as a group. Here are some ways our group has settled into our new identity. First, several of our 8th and 9th graders started a worship band for youth group. They lead worship at youth group 2-3 times a month, and led a worship song during the Sunday service 2 times this past year. And they were a big hit during each VBS closing this July. Secondly, our group has moved away from being more of a high energy athletic group, to doing games that are more strategic and medium level activity. Lastly, we moved to having younger leaders within the student ministry. Our average grade level dropped from 11th grade to 9th grade, so we are having brand new ideas and voices in leadership. Building off of this past year, we are looking forward to solidifying more of our new vibe as a group and having our now younger crowd keep bringing ideas for the student ministry.

Youth Group:

This past school year, I taught several different topics to the teens on Sunday night. We covered wisdom, identity, friendship, Bible basics, Christian theology basics, dating and marriage, spiritual habits, apologetics, and evangelism. We moved our teaching room from the Fellowship Hall to room 200, which was a great move. After most messages, we break into small groups to discuss the message, which the teens have said they continue to really enjoy. Another "new identity" aspect to Sunday night have been the 2 new young adult volunteers that were brought on. They have done a great job connecting with the teens and creating a safe place for our teens to grow in their faith.

Sunday Sessions:

Sunday Sessions has settled into our rhythm for what teens can expect from their time there. We continued to make it just for middle school students, and we strive to mimic the sermon theme in a way that connects better with them. We start the time by asking the teens how their week was 1-10. We want to have them know that we care about them, and if there is anything major going on they need to talk about, it is more important than the prepared lesson. Once we go around, we start in on a discussion-based lesson.

Life Groups:

Life Groups had some minor shifts this past school year. My high school group all graduated, and I went back to just leading one group, which is my middle school guys group. We had a middle school girls leader step away for life balance reasons, but overall, it was a solid year of life groups. Dave Endy's high school guys group committed to coming more often, my middle school guys group gained a new guy, Jen Smith's middle school girls group covered relevant topics, and Jen Riddell's high school girls' group really turned a corner in opening up more. Life Group ministry is where we continue to see the most life change happens in a teen's life, and we are so thankful to our leaders who pour into our teens.

Winter Retreat:

This was our third year doing a combined middle school and high school winter retreat, and it went great! It really helps having a weekend away as a whole group, to build out more of a family type feel within our group. The theme this year was building a relationship with Jesus. We had great conversations on what that means and looks like.

Harvey Cedars 2022:

Last year's Harvey Cedars week was not only extremely fun, but also very impactful. For the fun side, we played camp-wide games like capture the flag. We spent time at the beach playing games, and paddle boarding in the bay. We played our annual youth group game of spoons, went to Bay Village, and the Ron Jon Shop. For the impactful side, the worship services connected with the teens in powerful ways. We had conversations with the teens about what it means to place your faith in Jesus, one-on-one conversations about where they are at in their relationship with Jesus, and gave them time to spend in God's word. It was also the seniors' last year at Harvey, so there were a lot of tears on the last night. Overall, it was a wonderful week together creating fun memories and discipling teens in the faith.

Pittsburgh 2023

This summer, I took middle school and high school students out to Pittsburgh to serve with Group Missions. This year, we served at World Vision Distribution Center. The FBI confiscated tens of thousands of fake Nike's and Air Jordan's in the NYC Harbor. The sent them to World Vision, and we packed 6,000 of those shoes to be sent out to people in need around the world. We also processed 10,000 educational books to be sent out to schools in need around the world to get them ready for the upcoming school year. This year's theme was "Forged", which helped teens process some of the harder parts of their life so far, and how through God's strength we can persevere which builds character, and then gives us a renewed hope.

BOOM Week 2022

BOOM Week this past year was a blast! I had my summer intern, James Sahakian, prep and plan this week as one of his bigger projects. He did a great job planning it! We did a beach day, Six Flags Park, SkyZone, a pool party, camp out, multiple service projects, a drive-in movie, Shady Maple, a hike, and a fast food progressive dinner. The week ran as planned and everyone had a great time.

Thank you for your continued support of the student ministry. Through your help, we are making a difference in the next generation. We look forward to see how God will work in the student ministry this coming year.

Associate Pastor Report Young Adult Ministry

It has been my privilege to serve as the Associate Pastor of Youth and Young Adults at Trinity this past year. How do I sum up this past year? Some words that come to mind are surprised, roller coaster, defeated, winning. Throughout the fall, I continued to do what I had been doing, which was planning a longer and more in-depth lesson than youth group, and having our time together be more about the Bible and discipleship. No one was showing up. I felt confused and defeated. I started praying about it and talking to other young adults. Through listening to God and others, I shifted the emphasis to having the time together be more fun, and meeting less frequently. I moved young adults to the first Friday only and most of our time being dodgeball. I had no idea how it was going to go, but it was my last effort to try to reach young adults. This change happened in January. From January-June, our group went from no one showing up, to our last meeting having 18 young adults. Almost 50% of the group has angst against God or simply does not want anything to do with God. Through this ministry, I've been able to share Jesus with them during my devotionals. The group, made up of a lot of different types of young adults, is starting to congeal. It is my hope that come the fall, we could take the next step with the group. Please be praying for the group, that those who have hard feelings towards God/the Church, and do not believe in God, would be softened, and come to place their faith in Christ.

Director of Children's Ministries Report

It has been such a blessing to recount God's faithfulness and the wonderful works that He has done in and through Trinity this past year! "Lord, you are my God; I will exalt You and praise Your Name, for in perfect faithfulness You have done wonderful things, things planned long ago." Isaiah 25:1

Kids Connection: We are growing, and God has been working in exciting ways! Twenty-three dedicated volunteers lovingly and faithfully invest themselves into our children on Sunday mornings in Kids Connection. The change of having the children begin in the sanctuary for family worship before being dismissed to Kids Connection has been fruitful in many ways. Children are learning that they are an important part of the Body of Christ, and it has been a blessing to see them join in worship and connect with others in the congregation. The children have had several opportunities to serve and minister to others in the congregation through our Children's Handbell Choir, a Palm Sunday performance, and leading songs. We are continuing to look for more ways for the children to become more involved on Sunday mornings. After the children are dismissed to Kids Connection, we begin our time with large group songs, prayer, Bible memory, and discussion. Our Bible videos do a wonderful job of helping the children to visually learn about the lesson before we break into small groups and dig deeper into the lesson and application. We also continue to have a time of crafts and games for the children to reinforce the Bible lessons. Another blessing for me has been to watch as families form and deepen relationships both inside and outside of the building and do more life together. On 5th Sundays, our Mission Minded Kids team has been doing a great job teaching the children about our E.C. missionaries. Our current offering project is John and Kathy Wilson, missionaries in Papua New Guinea. The children have a heart for missions and are learning that they can show God's love and make an impact around the world and locally by giving and using their Godgiven gifts and talents.

VBS: Out-of-this-World VBS was a great success! Seventy-eight volunteers invested their time, energy, talents, and hearts to help share Jesus' love with 168 individual children from our community! This year was a VBS record for both attendance and offering received! For our VBS Missions Project, the children raised over \$2,298 to help John and Kathy Wilson continue to translate the Bible for the Binandere people! The boys won the offering contest this year, and one of our female teens got slimed! Plot twist! A last-minute, anonymous donor gave so that there would be a tie, so our male teen also got slimed! We welcomed our teen worship band to lead each night VBS this year, and what a blessing they were! We pray that the Holy Spirit stirs the hearts of these precious children, and that seeds of faith were planted through this ministry!

GAK (God's Amazing Kids): Children ages 3 through 5th grade are invited to join us every Wednesday evening from the beginning of October until the end of March. What a year it was! We had record attendance this year. With the need to split into more classes, God was faithful in providing the volunteers we needed just at the right time. This program continues to reach many community and

Cornerstone families with the life-changing gospel of Jesus.We continue to see crossover from GAK to Sunday School, and it's exciting!

Family Events: Our 2nd annual Trunk-or-Treat event at Trinity was another great success. Over 300 children from our community enjoyed awesomely decorated trunks, games, candy, interactions with our church family, rescue vehicles, ice cream, and a petting zoo! All who joined us were invited to VBS, and several families attended. Christmas caroling was a blessing to both the carolers and the caroled-to in Presidential Estates. It was a joyful night sharing about the love of Jesus through our voices. After we finish singing, we handed a treat and invite to our Christmas Eve service. Please consider joining us this year. We've had good turnouts for Family Movie Nights and have another one scheduled in August. Families whose paths might not normally cross (Kids Connection, VBS, GAK, Cornerstone, etc.) come together for a fun night. There is opportunity to make connections, form relationships with one another, and learn more about other Trinity ministries and events.

Thank you, Trinity family, for continuing to pray for, volunteer in, and give to Children's Ministry. God continues to do good things and is using you to share His love and the good news of God's salvation with our children. I am excited for what is ahead!

Director of Cornerstone Preschool Report

Cornerstone Preschool continues to be a wonderful outreach to families in our community. Cornerstone provides quality Christian education to children from ages 2 through prekindergarten. We are dedicated to helping children reach their individual potential physically, intellectually, emotionally, socially, and spiritually, all while learning about the love of Jesus. Families of children who attend Cornerstone are introduced to and have gone on to attend Kids Connection on Sunday mornings, GAK (God's Amazing Kids) on Wednesday evenings, Sunday worship services, VBS, youth group, and other Trinity events! We continue to see crossover from Cornerstone Preschool to Sunday School, and it's exciting!

Special events like the Christmas Program, Book Fair, Grandparents' Days, Easter Egg Hunt, Pre-K Graduation, and our End-of-School Celebration provide opportunities to bond with our families and create memorable experiences for our children. The Frecon Farms Thanksgiving Pie Sale was a huge success and will be returning in the fall! Funds raised support our Children of Promise Scholarship Fund. Our Blessing Others Christmas Tree provided Cornerstone families the opportunity to show love to others by donating food items. Christmas baskets were given to our Trinity friends who are homebound, have experienced a recent loss, or are residing in assisted-living facilities. For our Scholastic Book Fair, children more than doubled our goal. Those funds help us purchase furniture and books for our classrooms.

Because of your generous donations, we were able to open a 3rd Pre-K class this past year and minister to even more families in our community. Ten total classes were offered, and we will have a need to add one more in the fall.

Our Children of Promise Scholarship Fund is supported through Cornerstone fundraising efforts as well as contributions from our Trinity family. This scholarship has allowed many families to send their children to Preschool, even when financial difficulties would otherwise keep them from participating. Thank you, Trinity family, for the generous gifts you have given to support this scholarship fund. By doing so, you have helped to financially sponsor children and partnered with us in sharing Jesus' love.

For Pre-K graduation this year, I asked Trinity to prayerfully consider donating toward the purchase of Bibles for all of our Pre-K graduates. Through you generous giving, all 55 of our Pre-K graduates received a Bible, and there were enough funds leftover to purchase an additional 218 Bibles for future graduating classes! What a beautiful way to end the year. Students were invited to attend VBS over the summer, and it was such a blessing to reconnect with lots of our current and former Cornerstone children. For the upcoming 2023-2024 school year, there is a lot to be excited about. We currently have 125 students enrolled, and the numbers continue to grow! Because of the growing need for preschool classes in our community, we have added one more class for the fall, which will bring the total to 11 classes. We hope to transform one of our rooms into a sensory room. All students will have the opportunity to enjoy this room, and it will be especially helpful for children who need time and space to self-regulate. Another hope for this year is that we will be able to offer a summer camp in 2024.

I'd like to say a sincere thank you to our Cornerstone Board of Directors for their continued support and collective wisdom and experience.

As preparations and plans are being made for the new school year, please be in prayer for our Cornerstone staff. Please also join us in praying for the children and families who will come under our care. May we reflect the love of Jesus in everything that we say and do.

Additional surge protection was added to several other key computer locations in response to the surge that occurred to prevent this from happening again.
- Our sanctuary baby grand piano was reconditioned after over a decade of weekly use. Work completed was a full tuning, polished and lubricated pins, new bushings, hammer reshaping, and keyboard dip and travel adjustments.
- The door at the handicap main entrance broke off of its corroded hinge pivots and was dragging on the ground. New parts were ordered and I was able to repair it in a few hours.
- Five diseased dead ash trees at the north end of our property in the tree line were removed. One of them was very large and close to route 100, posing a safety concern near the heavy traffic.
- The church website continues to be updated weekly with up-to-date content, including livestream videos, photos, audio sermons, events, and publications such as the bulletins and sermon outlines.
- Our new Keri Doors software program, which electronically controls five different access points throughout the church building, is running well. These five locations now all require the use of personal key fobs for entry and enhanced security. Each door on the system is now fully programmable to schedule lock and unlock times based on ministry needs.
- Our handicap ramp and the outdoor steps leading into the prayer room have been resurfaced with a 5-layer epoxy coating. The many cracks were filled before the coating was applied and the work is warranted for 20 years. The cost of the epoxy coating was considerably less than what it would cost to pour new concrete in these areas.
- Six different toilets and urinals were repaired in-house over the past year. Most were located down in the preschool, where they receive a lot of constant use.

Every year I feel blessed to be able to help further improve and enhance our Lord's house and His property. I continue to address weekly wear and tear repairs, as well as provide physical support to our various church ministries.

Church Financial Officer/Finance Ministry Team Report

I continue to be so blessed when I see how God has provided financially for Trinity Church through the generosity and faithfulness of our church family! Because of your gifts, we are able to make an impact in our community and across the globe for the Gospel. And that's no little thing!

All of our bills have been paid in full and on time. Our obligations to the denomination (ministry funds and special offerings) are current.

Our Audit Panel reviewed the books for 2021-2022 last November and found them to be complete and in good order. I am grateful for the efforts of this group and appreciate them taking a detailed second look at my work. I thank Dan Brown for his invaluable help in setting up the details of their tasks and for his service as an Auditor. And I'm grateful that Tom Wetzel will be joining the group this fall!

When I took over this position, I noted that we pay property taxes, which puzzled me since churches are exempt from property taxes. I asked Pastor John and various other "long-timers" and got a variety of answers, but all of them pointed to the fact that there was some sort of agreement with the County that required us to pay taxes on a portion of our property (some thought it began in 1994 with the subdivision for then Pastor Kevin's home). No one could produce any agreement or proof, but they seemed certain. So I let it ride. Until this May when I began investigating this matter. The answer I found with the assistance of Douglass Township and Montgomery County Board of Assessment Appeals personnel is very simple. When Trinity purchased this property, it was two separate lots. One was purchased in December 1973 and the other in April 1974. While original County documents that old are not readily available, there is nothing noted, as it would be, about any agreement for Trinity to pay property taxes, and all the records that are available point to the simple fact that when the first lot was purchased, no exemption request was filed. That request was filed for the second lot in 1974 at the time of purchase. So for 50 years we have been paying tax on a piece of property all for the lack of one piece of paper! I have now filed for exemption and am hopeful that by the time of our Annual Meeting, the matter will be resolved in our favor and beginning in 2024, we will no longer pay property taxes on any of our property. This represents a savings of over \$4,700.00 a year for Trinity. Unfortunately, the law makes no provision for us to be able to obtain all or any portion as a refund.

Matt Obarow works hard to keep our church and equipment in good shape and I am glad to say that we have been able to pay for everything that needs to be done. One project that will be coming up in the next 5-10 years is the resurfacing of our parking lot – a big task in more ways than one. When the time draws closer, the Finance Ministry Team will work with Matt to determine our best option financially.

I continue to enjoy my financial work at Trinity and am very grateful for the opportunity. I am grateful for the members of the Finance Ministry Team – Dan Leffel, Bob Mock, and Pastor Les – and would welcome other interested folks to inquire about joining our group. As always, any Trinity member is welcome to ask questions, look at records, or talk to me about any Trinity financial concerns.

Community Benevolence Report

In May of 2022, we introduced a new Community Outreach opportunity – a Community Benevolence fund. These gifts would be received when a month has a 5th Sunday, and used to help non-Trinity folks in our neighborhood (roughly defined as the Boyertown school district) who have needs that they are unable to meet.

Pastor Les and I established a list of questions for these individuals to answer so we can determine the need is legitimate, and that helping them will not make them more dependent on the "system", if possible. We hope folks will be able to move past their tough spots into a more stable, safe environment. And due to the answers to our questions, we have turned down more than a few requests for a variety of reasons. We need to be good stewards of what you have so freely given.

Most of the folks whom we have helped have come to us through either Boyertown Area Multi-Service or Boyertown Salvation Army. We are not looking to become the first clearinghouse for folks in need, but are blessed to come alongside one of these agencies and make a difference. If an individual were to call us directly, I would direct them to one of these agencies and then work with that agency.

Both Multi-Service and Salvation Army have firm guidelines about how often and in what ways they can offer assistance. When they come to us for help, it's either because the need exceeds their dollar amount cap or they have already assisted this person within the last 12 months. Since the fund began in 2022, we have helped 17 individuals and families with housing, gas to get to work and medical treatments, cremation costs, and utility payments. When I explain the fund is provided through the generous giving of our church family members as a way of sharing God's love with our neighbors, most folks (neighbors, merchants, and landlords) are especially moved.

Your gifts are making a difference in the lives of people in our community, and we hope we will be blessed to be able to continue this ministry for a long time.

Tech Ministry Team Report

The Tech Ministry ensures the proper operation of many computers, sound equipment, lighting systems, video projectors, and livestream equipment all throughout the building at Trinity Church. In addition to managing and maintain all the equipment, the leaders also help train people. We have a dedicated group of volunteers who serve on Sunday mornings, donating their time and talents to help enhance our worship experience.

This Spring we lost our Rane DSP (digital signal processor) in the sanctuary sound system due to a momentary power blackout at the church. The DSP routs many of the signals to several of the speakers in the sanctuary, including the subwoofers. We only had about half of our typical speakers functioning for about three months while we were looking at repair and replacement options. Ultimately, we had to replace the DSP with a new Allen and Heath unit due to supply chain issues, which prevented us from finding the correct replacement parts. To prevent this from happening again, we increased our surge protection on many key pieces of equipment everywhere in the building.

Our Mac Pro computer in the sanctuary, which projects media to all the screens in the sanctuary, needed several important updates in order to run the latest version of our primary software, Pro Presenter 7. The computer was upgraded four operating systems from High Sierra 10.13 up to Monterey 12.6. This computer is approaching 10 years old, so we were thankful that it was still able to handle the new projection software.

Three computers in the children's ministry were upgraded this year and added to the Trinity network. One of them was for media presentations in the main Kid's Connection area, and the other two were for checking in kids on Sunday mornings, as well as occasional use by the Cornerstone preschool teachers during the school year.

One piece of news is we have a new person - Jennifer Patles - who has agreed to help us with creating sermon series graphics. Jennifer jumped right in and has already produced some amazing work for us. You may have noticed her work during our 2022 Advent series and our recent Apostles' Creed series. We are so thankful for her talents and her willingness to be involved with this ministry team. We are also thankful for my father, John, for his photographic prowess and for taking pictures for our Online Photo Directory as well as various occasions throughout the year such as the Hanging of the Greens service. We thank him for his beautiful work and his willingness to contribute his talents in this way.

World Missions Ministry Report

This past year Trinity Church helped to support 14 full time missionaries and three missionary groups through the Global Ministries Commission of the Evangelical Congregational Church. We support the Denominations administrative efforts as well as local missional churches.

We also supported five full time missionaries that serve outside of the GMC through other missionary organizations.

The basic changes to the Missions budget this year include a 3% increase to the individual missionaries. This is keeping with our deciding to have our missionary support commensurate to the increases to our staff salaries.

In addition, with Dave Hershey coming off of the mission field we also propose to add to Dan & Mary Wills, the support formerly sent to Dave.

These changes are noted in the proposed budget.

There are five sections to the AMF budget. The Denominational Missions Offerings, Missions Support through the Global Ministries Community, Support Funds for Missions Works, Additional Outreach Ministries and a Miscellaneous category. Here is a summation of the mission efforts:

The 2023 Sportsmen's Dinner was once again a huge success! All available tickets were sold, and over 300 people attended the event to enjoy an evening of great wild game food, and fellowship along with an inspiring Christian message presented by Billy Molls aka the Modern Day Mountain Man.

As a result of Billy's testimony and his presentation of the Gospel, seven people came to know Jesus for the first time and approximately 30 more checked the box to rededicate their lives to Jesus and Christian service. As an added benefit, approximately \$7000 was raised to split amongst the designated charities!

Due the retirement of Steve Rothenberger, who has led this outreach since it began seven years ago, and a lack of interested volunteers to continue this ministry, we do not have plans to hold further Sportsmen's Dinners at this time.

Reconstructed Minutes of Trinity Church's Annual Congregational Meeting August 28, 2022

(the original minutes have been lost; this document is reconstructed using Pastor Les' meeting "script")

Opening

Pastor Les called the meeting to order. He began by reading the definition of a Member in Good Standing. He then opened the meeting in prayer.

He appointed Mike Montanye secretary of the meeting and announced the tellers for the meeting: Joe Slavinski, head teller; Meghan Carr; Cyndi Hunter; Cathy Nicolosi; Rick Ossman; and Karen Ossman. Kevin Patton was appointed the "mic runner" so that comments from the floor can be heard by all.

Pastor Les explained that there were two tables up front with lists of names of members in good standing. All attendees who are eligible and who will vote must sign in. Tellers will verify the head count. He explained that those who will vote need to be seated in one of the two center sections. The side sections will serve as the gallery for non-voting observers. He encouraged folks to remain in the room during the entire meeting so they would not miss out on any voting.

He announced the quorum by our bylaws is 20% of our members in good standing. For today's meeting, based on 148 such members, we need 30 members for a quorum. The tellers report we have 65 members in good standing (later corrected to 66). Since quorum has been established, the meeting can continue.

Communications

Pastor Les announced that the church office receives thank you notes each time we make a donation to the Boyertown Salvation Army or Boyertown Area Multi-Service. We also received a thank you note from one of the Angel Tree recipients. It was forwarded to Mandi Remick who heads up that project. Thank you notes and newsletters from missionaries are passed on by email to those who have requested these and are posted in the missionary area of the lobby.

He also shared information about the Worship Pastor Escrow Fund. He said that to date, we have received \$32,004, which is possibly enough for a half year's salary. Based on our current circumstances and current needs, we are no longer actively soliciting funds for this position. The monies will be set aside, and if and when our need and circumstances change, will be used then for that purpose.

Pastor Les also reported that under the supervision of the Pastoral Relations Committee and Leadership Team we have updated the six pastoral and support staff job descriptions to meet current ministry needs and expectations. If you are curious, please ask and we'll be happy to share these with you.

He also announced two corrections to the Annual Report -

Page 37 – Harry and Sandy Moore – membership removed at their request

Page 39 – the second Linda Ziegler should be William Ziegler

Follow Up from Last Year's Meeting

Last year we approved the addition of up to 2 members-at-large to the Leadership Team. Neither position has been filled yet.

We approved the addition of the Leader of the Worship Ministry Team to the Leadership Team. This team has not been created yet but we are working toward that.

There has been some confusion about who is what and does what musically –

- Worship Ministry Team Leader volunteer leader of this ministry team
- Music Coordinators Carole Bean and Jann Huggens small salary; they assist staff with Sunday's music selections
- Worship Pastor future position with a salary; may become Worship Ministry Team Leader
- Worship Leaders volunteers who lead worship on Sunday mornings

Votes

Pastor Les explained the first several votes will be by voice. If a vote is too close to determine by voice, a standing vote will occur.

- Change in church fiscal year from Aug 1 -July 31 to Sept 1 -Aug 31. This will eliminate beginning a fiscal year before the annual meeting. It will create a 13-month time period for this year, but will be resolved beginning Sept 1, 2023. MOTION: The LT moved that we shift the fiscal year from "August 1st to the following July 31th to September 1st to the following August 31st. The motion was seconded. There were no comments or questions. The motion passed by a unanimous voice vote.
- Because of the work of the PRC and HR, this MOTION is made: The LT moves that we add the position of Human Resource Ministry Team Chairperson to the Leadership Team. The motion was seconded. There were no comments or questions. The motion passed by a unanimous voice vote.
- To further clarify the work and role of the PRC, the PRC makes this MOTION: that we adopt the LT approved changes to the 2021 bylaws, Article X, to replace the lengthy section added last year with the shorter and more precise content and placing the removed material in the PRC Policy Manual. (Both the shorter bylaw section and the PRC Policy Manual Material were available for members to review two weeks before the Annual Meeting.) The motion was seconded; no comments or questions; motion passed with a unanimous voice vote.
- The next motion is included so the bylaw document can be corrected as needed to align with the change from CA to PRC. MOTION: The LT moves that we give the Staff permission to make the necessary changes in the Bylaws to align the whole document with the more recent structural changes – CA to PRC. The motion was seconded; there were no comments or questions; and the motion passed with a unanimous voice vote.
- The last voice vote concerns editorial and minor content changes to our bylaws, as listed in our Annual Report. MOTION: The LT moves that we adopt the editorial and minor

content changes that have been noted in preparation for today's meeting. The motion was seconded; there were no questions or comments; and the motion passed with a unanimous voice vote.

The final two votes were by ballot.

- The first one was for the Slate of Election as presented in the Annual Report. Pastor Les had the tellers pass out these ballots to those seated in the two center sections. Elaine Stein made a motion that we adopt the State of Election as presented. Peg Stuart seconded the motion. There were no comments or questions. Voters were then directed to mark their ballot either "yes" or "no" or to leave it blank to abstain. The tellers collected all the ballots and counted. There were 65 yes votes with one abstention.
- The second vote was to accept the FY 2022-2023 budget. Pastor Les had the tellers pass out these ballots to those seated in the two center sections. After he described how the change in the fiscal year will affect the budget (the budget is created for 12 months but will cover 13 months due to that change, etc.), he called for a motion to adopt the proposed FY 2022-2023 budget. Kevin Patton made the motion; it was seconded by Elaine Stein. The members were directed to mark their ballot either "yes" or "no" or to leave it blank to abstain. The letters collected all the ballots and counted. There were 64 yes votes with two abstentions.

Conclusion

Pastor Les asked if any of the staff or ministry team leaders had anything to add to the reports they presented in the Annual Report. No one did.

He asked the members present if there were any questions or comments on the reports or the information shared at this meeting. There were none.

He then asked for a motion to receive the reports as posted. Motion was made by Bob Stein, seconded by Russ Cook. There were no comments or questions, and the motion passed by a unanimous voice vote.

Pastor Les reported there is no old or unfinished business to process today, and that there is no new business to handle today.

He called for motion to refer the minutes to the LT for approval. The motion was made by Mary Krause, seconded by Earl Geiger. There were no comments or questions, and the motion passed with a unanimous voice vote.

There being no further business, Pastor Les called for a motion to adjourn. Pastor Gary Bosler made that motion, and Frank Larkin seconded the motion. Pastor Les then called for all in favor to rise for closing prayer, which he offered.

About twelve years ago, Trinity Church and the EC Church partnered to launch a new ministry to reach the unchurched and de-churched of the greater Pottstown area. Journey 53, a non-traditional church ministry, has done exactly what they set out to do . . . reach people for Christ and his Church. Rev. Rick Christman continues to lead this ministry. Below is an update report from Rick. I was thrilled to read what Rick wrote. Even more so when we sat while I listened to story after story of life change. I thought you needed to see this as well.

Journey 53 Report

Rick Christmas

Journey 53 is still about three things after all these years: Love God, love others, and serve the world!

In the past twelve years we have encouraged over 275 people to either begin a relationship with God or rekindle a relationship that had been lost. Many of those 275 people have been successfully assimilated into many local churches, and most are involved in ministry and local church leadership; two of those families are in paid ministry positions in their local church. In many of our friend circles, we are the only connection point as followers of Christ that some of them have.

In 2022, we reached the goal of giving 10% of our J53 income away. We were able to bless the Kingdom Outreach (part of the E.C. denomination), two different mission groups, and other families in need across the Boyertown Area.

There are six families that are worshiping with us regularly right now, and we are working on assimilating one of our families back into a local church. We have realized that we are a transitional ministry in which people come to Christ or back to Christ before transitioning to other Christian communities.

There are many personal stories in which we have been able to connect people with God that are too long and too numerous to share. Thanks for praying for us in this work that God has called us to do.

Active Beyond Trinity

I leave my home each day hoping to make a difference, not just here at Trinity, but also in my neighborhood or grocery store. I want my presence to make a difference. Beyond that I try to make full use of my gifts, graces, skills, and experiences to add to the Church. I do that here at Trinity and in other churches and for our denomination.

I also coach and/or train other pastors and church leaders/leadership teams when invited. I am an active member of the annual EC Church's Pastoral Assessment Center in January. Carol usually joins me for that adventure. I am a member of a team of pastors that walks beside struggling churches and helps strengthen their serve. And as a credentialed coach, I coach – individuals (life, grief, self-improvement) and teams (usually church leadership teams). Please pray with me as I try to be a good steward of the spiritual gifts, professional skills, and passions I have been blessed with or acquired.

Carol and I thank you for your love and support, and for your partnership in our corporate Jesus adventures. Thank you also for allowing us to be part of your lives. You have become like family. Thank you for your prayers as we seek to maintain balance in our lives, at home, with you, in our community, and for the larger Kingdom.

Associate Pastor Report Elevate Student Ministry

Theme:

It has been my privilege to serve as the Associate Pastor of Youth and Young Adults here at Trinity this past year. This past year within the student ministry, a prevailing theme has been "a new identity". We had a large and very influential senior class graduate, and a few other teens move away, so our group this past school year has been slowly finding our new identity as a group. Here are some ways our group has settled into our new identity. First, several of our 8th and 9th graders started a worship band for youth group. They lead worship at youth group 2-3 times a month, and led a worship song during the Sunday service 2 times this past year. And they were a big hit during each VBS closing this July. Secondly, our group has moved away from being more of a high energy athletic group, to doing games that are more strategic and medium level activity. Lastly, we moved to having younger leaders within the student ministry. Our average grade level dropped from 11th grade to 9th grade, so we are having brand new ideas and voices in leadership. Building off of this past year, we are looking forward to solidifying more of our new vibe as a group and having our now younger crowd keep bringing ideas for the student ministry.

Youth Group:

This past school year, I taught several different topics to the teens on Sunday night. We covered wisdom, identity, friendship, Bible basics, Christian theology basics, dating and marriage, spiritual habits, apologetics, and evangelism. We moved our teaching room from the Fellowship Hall to room 200, which was a great move. After most messages, we break into small groups to discuss the message, which the teens have said they continue to really enjoy. Another "new identity" aspect to Sunday night have been the 2 new young adult volunteers that were brought on. They have done a great job connecting with the teens and creating a safe place for our teens to grow in their faith.

Sunday Sessions:

Sunday Sessions has settled into our rhythm for what teens can expect from their time there. We continued to make it just for middle school students, and we strive to mimic the sermon theme in a way that connects better with them. We start the time by asking the teens how their week was 1-10. We want to have them know that we care about them, and if there is anything major going on they need to talk about, it is more important than the prepared lesson. Once we go around, we start in on a discussion-based lesson.

Life Groups:

Life Groups had some minor shifts this past school year. My high school group all graduated, and I went back to just leading one group, which is my middle school guys group. We had a middle school girls leader step away for life balance reasons, but overall, it was a solid year of life groups. Dave Endy's high school guys group committed to coming more often, my middle school guys group gained a new guy, Jen Smith's middle school girls group covered relevant topics, and Jen Riddell's high school girls' group really turned a corner in opening up more. Life Group ministry is where we continue to see the most life change happens in a teen's life, and we are so thankful to our leaders who pour into our teens.

Winter Retreat:

This was our third year doing a combined middle school and high school winter retreat, and it went great! It really helps having a weekend away as a whole group, to build out more of a family type feel within our group. The theme this year was building a relationship with Jesus. We had great conversations on what that means and looks like.

Harvey Cedars 2022:

Last year's Harvey Cedars week was not only extremely fun, but also very impactful. For the fun side, we played camp-wide games like capture the flag. We spent time at the beach playing games, and paddle boarding in the bay. We played our annual youth group game of spoons, went to Bay Village, and the Ron Jon Shop. For the impactful side, the worship services connected with the teens in powerful ways. We had conversations with the teens about what it means to place your faith in Jesus, one-on-one conversations about where they are at in their relationship with Jesus, and gave them time to spend in God's word. It was also the seniors' last year at Harvey, so there were a lot of tears on the last night. Overall, it was a wonderful week together creating fun memories and discipling teens in the faith.

Pittsburgh 2023

This summer, I took middle school and high school students out to Pittsburgh to serve with Group Missions. This year, we served at World Vision Distribution Center. The FBI confiscated tens of thousands of fake Nike's and Air Jordan's in the NYC Harbor. The sent them to World Vision, and we packed 6,000 of those shoes to be sent out to people in need around the world. We also processed 10,000 educational books to be sent out to schools in need around the world to get them ready for the upcoming school year. This year's theme was "Forged", which helped teens process some of the harder parts of their life so far, and how through God's strength we can persevere which builds character, and then gives us a renewed hope.

BOOM Week 2022

BOOM Week this past year was a blast! I had my summer intern, James Sahakian, prep and plan this week as one of his bigger projects. He did a great job planning it! We did a beach day, Six Flags Park, SkyZone, a pool party, camp out, multiple service projects, a drive-in movie, Shady Maple, a hike, and a fast food progressive dinner. The week ran as planned and everyone had a great time.

Thank you for your continued support of the student ministry. Through your help, we are making a difference in the next generation. We look forward to see how God will work in the student ministry this coming year.

Please be praying for the group, that those who have hard feelings towards God/the Church, and do not believe in God, would be softened, and come to place their faith in Christ.

Director of Children's Ministries Report

Kids Connection: We are growing, and God has been working in exciting ways! Twenty-three dedicated volunteers lovingly and faithfully invest themselves into our children on Sunday mornings in Kids Connection. The change of having the children begin in the sanctuary for family worship before being dismissed to Kids Connection has been fruitful in many ways. Children are learning that they are an important part of the Body of Christ, and it has been a blessing to see them join in worship and connect with others in the congregation. The children have had several opportunities to serve and minister to others in the congregation through our Children's Handbell Choir, a Palm Sunday performance, and leading songs. We are continuing to look for more ways for the children to become more involved on Sunday mornings. After the children are dismissed to Kids Connection, we begin our time with large group songs, prayer, Bible memory, and discussion. Our Bible videos do a wonderful job of helping the children to visually learn about the lesson before we break into small groups and dig deeper into the lesson and application. We also continue to have a time of crafts and games for the children to reinforce the Bible lessons. Another blessing for me has been to watch as families form and deepen relationships both inside and outside of the building and do more life together. On 5th Sundays, our Mission Minded Kids team has been doing a great job teaching the children about our E.C. missionaries. Our current offering project is John and Kathy Wilson, missionaries in Papua New Guinea. The children have a heart for missions and are learning that they can show God's love and make an impact around the world and locally by giving and using their Godgiven gifts and talents.

VBS: Out-of-this-World VBS was a great success! Seventy-eight volunteers invested their time, energy, talents, and hearts to help share Jesus' love with 168 individual children from our community! This year was a VBS record for both attendance and offering received! For our VBS Missions Project, the children raised over \$2,298 to help John and Kathy Wilson continue to translate the Bible for the Binandere people! The boys won the offering contest this year, and one of our female teens got slimed! Plot twist! A last-minute, anonymous donor gave so that there would be a tie, so our male teen also got slimed! We welcomed our teen worship band to lead each night VBS this year, and what a blessing they were! We pray that the Holy Spirit stirs the hearts of these precious children, and that seeds of faith were planted through this ministry!

GAK (God's Amazing Kids): Children ages 3 through 5th grade are invited to join us every Wednesday evening from the beginning of October until the end of March. What a year it was! We had record attendance this year. With the need to split into more classes, God was faithful in providing the volunteers we needed just at the right time. This program continues to reach many community and

Cornerstone families with the life-changing gospel of Jesus.We continue to see crossover from GAK to Sunday School, and it's exciting!

Family Events: Our 2nd annual Trunk-or-Treat event at Trinity was another great success. Over 300 children from our community enjoyed awesomely decorated trunks, games, candy, interactions with our church family, rescue vehicles, ice cream, and a petting zoo! All who joined us were invited to VBS, and several families attended. Christmas caroling was a blessing to both the carolers and the caroled-to in Presidential Estates. It was a joyful night sharing about the love of Jesus through our voices. After we finish singing, we handed a treat and invite to our Christmas Eve service. Please consider joining us this year. We've had good turnouts for Family Movie Nights and have another one scheduled in August. Families whose paths might not normally cross (Kids Connection, VBS, GAK, Cornerstone, etc.) come together for a fun night. There is opportunity to make connections, form relationships with one another, and learn more about other Trinity ministries and events.

Cornerstone Preschool continues to be a wonderful outreach to families in our community. Cornerstone provides quality Christian education to children from ages 2 through prekindergarten. We are dedicated to helping children reach their individual potential physically, intellectually, emotionally, socially, and spiritually, all while learning about the love of Jesus. Families of children who attend Cornerstone are introduced to and have gone on to attend Kids Connection on Sunday mornings, GAK (God's Amazing Kids) on Wednesday evenings, Sunday worship services, VBS, youth group, and other Trinity events! We continue to see crossover from Cornerstone Preschool to Sunday School, and it's exciting!

Special events like the Christmas Program, Book Fair, Grandparents' Days, Easter Egg Hunt, Pre-K Graduation, and our End-of-School Celebration provide opportunities to bond with our families and create memorable experiences for our children. The Frecon Farms Thanksgiving Pie Sale was a huge success and will be returning in the fall! Funds raised support our Children of Promise Scholarship Fund. Our Blessing Others Christmas Tree provided Cornerstone families the opportunity to show love to others by donating food items. Christmas baskets were given to our Trinity friends who are homebound, have experienced a recent loss, or are residing in assisted-living facilities. For our Scholastic Book Fair, children more than doubled our goal. Those funds help us purchase furniture and books for our classrooms.

Because of your generous donations, we were able to open a 3rd Pre-K class this past year and minister to even more families in our community. Ten total classes were offered, and we will have a need to add one more in the fall.

Our Children of Promise Scholarship Fund is supported through Cornerstone fundraising efforts as well as contributions from our Trinity family. This scholarship has allowed many families to send their children to Preschool, even when financial difficulties would otherwise keep them from participating. Thank you, Trinity family, for the generous gifts you have given to support this scholarship fund. By doing so, you have helped to financially sponsor children and partnered with us in sharing Jesus' love.

For Pre-K graduation this year, I asked Trinity to prayerfully consider donating toward the purchase of Bibles for all of our Pre-K graduates. Through you generous giving, all 55 of our Pre-K graduates received a Bible, and there were enough funds leftover to purchase an additional 218 Bibles for future graduating classes! What a beautiful way to end the year. Students were invited to attend VBS over the summer, and it was such a blessing to reconnect with lots of our current and former Cornerstone children. For the upcoming 2023-2024 school year, there is a lot to be excited about. We currently have 125 students enrolled, and the numbers continue to grow! Because of the growing need for preschool classes in our community, we have added one more class for the fall, which will bring the total to 11 classes. We hope to transform one of our rooms into a sensory room. All students will have the opportunity to enjoy this room, and it will be especially helpful for children who need time and space to self-regulate. Another hope for this year is that we will be able to offer a summer camp in 2024.

I'd like to say a sincere thank you to our Cornerstone Board of Directors for their continued support and collective wisdom and experience.

As preparations and plans are being made for the new school year, please be in prayer for our Cornerstone staff. Please also join us in praying for the children and families who will come under our care. May we reflect the love of Jesus in everything that we say and do.

Property Director Report

2023 was another good year for the property and grounds at Trinity Church. Some noteworthy accomplishments for the year:

- One of the church office PCs was hit with a power surge from a storm, and was replaced with another existing church PC that was able to be reconditioned. Additional surge protection was added to several other key computer locations in response to the surge that occurred to prevent this from happening again.
- Our sanctuary baby grand piano was reconditioned after over a decade of weekly use. Work completed was a full tuning, polished and lubricated pins, new bushings, hammer reshaping, and keyboard dip and travel adjustments.
- The door at the handicap main entrance broke off of its corroded hinge pivots and was dragging on the ground. New parts were ordered and I was able to repair it in a few hours.
- Five diseased dead ash trees at the north end of our property in the tree line were removed. One of them was very large and close to route 100, posing a safety concern near the heavy traffic.
- The church website continues to be updated weekly with up-to-date content, including livestream videos, photos, audio sermons, events, and publications such as the bulletins and sermon outlines.
- Our new Keri Doors software program, which electronically controls five different access points throughout the church building, is running well. These five locations now all require the use of personal key fobs for entry and enhanced security. Each door on the system is now fully programmable to schedule lock and unlock times based on ministry needs.
- Our handicap ramp and the outdoor steps leading into the prayer room have been resurfaced with a 5-layer epoxy coating. The many cracks were filled before the coating was applied and the work is warranted for 20 years. The cost of the epoxy coating was considerably less than what it would cost to pour new concrete in these areas.
- Six different toilets and urinals were repaired in-house over the past year. Most were located down in the preschool, where they receive a lot of constant use.

Every year I feel blessed to be able to help further improve and enhance our Lord's house and His property. I continue to address weekly wear and tear repairs, as well as provide physical support to our various church ministries.

Church Financial Officer/Finance Ministry Team Report

I continue to be so blessed when I see how God has provided financially for Trinity Church through the generosity and faithfulness of our church family! Because of your gifts, we are able to make an impact in our community and across the globe for the Gospel. And that's no little thing!

All of our bills have been paid in full and on time. Our obligations to the denomination (ministry funds and special offerings) are current.

Our Audit Panel reviewed the books for 2021-2022 last November and found them to be complete and in good order. I am grateful for the efforts of this group and appreciate them taking a detailed second look at my work. I thank Dan Brown for his invaluable help in setting up the details of their tasks and for his service as an Auditor. And I'm grateful that Tom Wetzel will be joining the group this fall!

When I took over this position, I noted that we pay property taxes, which puzzled me since churches are exempt from property taxes. I asked Pastor John and various other "long-timers" and got a variety of answers, but all of them pointed to the fact that there was some sort of agreement with the County that required us to pay taxes on a portion of our property (some thought it began in 1994 with the subdivision for then Pastor Kevin's home). No one could produce any agreement or proof, but they seemed certain. So I let it ride. Until this May when I began investigating this matter. The answer I found with the assistance of Douglass Township and Montgomery County Board of Assessment Appeals personnel is very simple. When Trinity purchased this property, it was two separate lots. One was purchased in December 1973 and the other in April 1974. While original County documents that old are not readily available, there is nothing noted, as it would be, about any agreement for Trinity to pay property taxes, and all the records that are available point to the simple fact that when the first lot was purchased, no exemption request was filed. That request was filed for the second lot in 1974 at the time of purchase. So for 50 years we have been paying tax on a piece of property all for the lack of one piece of paper! I have now filed for exemption and am hopeful that by the time of our Annual Meeting, the matter will be resolved in our favor and beginning in 2024, we will no longer pay property taxes on any of our property. This represents a savings of over \$4,700.00 a year for Trinity. Unfortunately, the law makes no provision for us to be able to obtain all or any portion as a refund.

Matt Obarow works hard to keep our church and equipment in good shape and I am glad to say that we have been able to pay for everything that needs to be done. One project that will be coming up in the next 5-10 years is the resurfacing of our parking lot – a big task in more ways than one. When the time draws closer, the Finance Ministry Team will work with Matt to determine our best option financially.

I continue to enjoy my financial work at Trinity and am very grateful for the opportunity. I am grateful for the members of the Finance Ministry Team – Dan Leffel, Bob Mock, and Pastor Les – and would welcome other interested folks to inquire about joining our group. As always, any Trinity member is welcome to ask questions, look at records, or talk to me about any Trinity financial concerns.

Community Benevolence Report

In May of 2022, we introduced a new Community Outreach opportunity – a Community Benevolence fund. These gifts would be received when a month has a 5th Sunday, and used to help non-Trinity folks in our neighborhood (roughly defined as the Boyertown school district) who have needs that they are unable to meet.

Pastor Les and I established a list of questions for these individuals to answer so we can determine the need is legitimate, and that helping them will not make them more dependent on the "system", if possible. We hope folks will be able to move past their tough spots into a more stable, safe environment. And due to the answers to our questions, we have turned down more than a few requests for a variety of reasons. We need to be good stewards of what you have so freely given.

Most of the folks whom we have helped have come to us through either Boyertown Area Multi-Service or Boyertown Salvation Army. We are not looking to become the first clearinghouse for folks in need, but are blessed to come alongside one of these agencies and make a difference. If an individual were to call us directly, I would direct them to one of these agencies and then work with that agency.

Both Multi-Service and Salvation Army have firm guidelines about how often and in what ways they can offer assistance. When they come to us for help, it's either because the need exceeds their dollar amount cap or they have already assisted this person within the last 12 months. Since the fund began in 2022, we have helped 17 individuals and families with housing, gas to get to work and medical treatments, cremation costs, and utility payments. When I explain the fund is provided through the generous giving of our church family members as a way of sharing God's love with our neighbors, most folks (neighbors, merchants, and landlords) are especially moved.

Your gifts are making a difference in the lives of people in our community, and we hope we will be blessed to be able to continue this ministry for a long time.

A mix of music (Carole Bean and Lexi Miller) and teaching (Carol) and discussion (the ladies) made for a stimulating morning. Tech Ministry Team Report

The Tech Ministry ensures the proper operation of many computers, sound equipment, lighting systems, video projectors, and livestream equipment all throughout the building at Trinity Church. In addition to managing and maintain all the equipment, the leaders also help train people. We have a dedicated group of volunteers who serve on Sunday mornings, donating their time and talents to help enhance our worship experience.

This Spring we lost our Rane DSP (digital signal processor) in the sanctuary sound system due to a momentary power blackout at the church. The DSP routs many of the signals to several of the speakers in the sanctuary, including the subwoofers. We only had about half of our typical speakers functioning for about three months while we were looking at repair and replacement options. Ultimately, we had to replace the DSP with a new Allen and Heath unit due to supply chain issues, which prevented us from finding the correct replacement parts. To prevent this from happening again, we increased our surge protection on many key pieces of equipment everywhere in the building.

Our Mac Pro computer in the sanctuary, which projects media to all the screens in the sanctuary, needed several important updates in order to run the latest version of our primary software, Pro Presenter 7. The computer was upgraded four operating systems from High Sierra 10.13 up to Monterey 12.6. This computer is approaching 10 years old, so we were thankful that it was still able to handle the new projection software.

Three computers in the children's ministry were upgraded this year and added to the Trinity network. One of them was for media presentations in the main Kid's Connection area, and the other two were for checking in kids on Sunday mornings, as well as occasional use by the Cornerstone preschool teachers during the school year.

One piece of news is we have a new person - Jennifer Patles - who has agreed to help us with creating sermon series graphics. Jennifer jumped right in and has already produced some amazing work for us. You may have noticed her work during our 2022 Advent series and our recent Apostles' Creed series. We are so thankful for her talents and her willingness to be involved with this ministry team. We are also thankful for my father, John, for his photographic prowess and for taking pictures for our Online Photo Directory as well as various occasions throughout the year such as the Hanging of the Greens service. We thank him for his beautiful work and his willingness to contribute his talents in this way.

World Missions Ministry Report

This past year Trinity Church helped to support 14 full time missionaries and three missionary groups through the Global Ministries Commission of the Evangelical Congregational Church. We support the Denominations administrative efforts as well as local missional churches.

We also supported five full time missionaries that serve outside of the GMC through other missionary organizations.

The basic changes to the Missions budget this year include a 3% increase to the individual missionaries. This is keeping with our deciding to have our missionary support commensurate to the increases to our staff salaries.

In addition, with Dave Hershey coming off of the mission field we also propose to add to Dan & Mary Wills, the support formerly sent to Dave.

These changes are noted in the proposed budget.

There are five sections to the AMF budget. The Denominational Missions Offerings, Missions Support through the Global Ministries Community, Support Funds for Missions Works, Additional Outreach Ministries and a Miscellaneous category. Here is a summation of the mission efforts:

As a result of Billy's testimony and his presentation of the Gospel, seven people came to know Jesus for the first time and approximately 30 more checked the box to rededicate their lives to Jesus and Christian service. As an added benefit, approximately \$7000 was raised to split amongst the designated charities!

Due the retirement of Steve Rothenberger, who has led this outreach since it began seven years ago, and a lack of interested volunteers to continue this ministry, we do not have plans to hold further Sportsmen's Dinners at this time.

Reconstructed Minutes of Trinity Church's Annual Congregational Meeting August 28, 2022

(the original minutes have been lost; this document is reconstructed using Pastor Les' meeting "script")

Opening

Pastor Les called the meeting to order. He began by reading the definition of a Member in Good Standing. He then opened the meeting in prayer.

He appointed Mike Montanye secretary of the meeting and announced the tellers for the meeting: Joe Slavinski, head teller; Meghan Carr; Cyndi Hunter; Cathy Nicolosi; Rick Ossman; and Karen Ossman. Kevin Patton was appointed the "mic runner" so that comments from the floor can be heard by all.

Pastor Les explained that there were two tables up front with lists of names of members in good standing. All attendees who are eligible and who will vote must sign in. Tellers will verify the head count. He explained that those who will vote need to be seated in one of the two center sections. The side sections will serve as the gallery for non-voting observers. He encouraged folks to remain in the room during the entire meeting so they would not miss out on any voting.

He announced the quorum by our bylaws is 20% of our members in good standing. For today's meeting, based on 148 such members, we need 30 members for a quorum. The tellers report we have 65 members in good standing (later corrected to 66). Since quorum has been established, the meeting can continue.

Communications

Pastor Les announced that the church office receives thank you notes each time we make a donation to the Boyertown Salvation Army or Boyertown Area Multi-Service. We also received a thank you note from one of the Angel Tree recipients. It was forwarded to Mandi Remick who heads up that project. Thank you notes and newsletters from missionaries are passed on by email to those who have requested these and are posted in the missionary area of the lobby.

He also shared information about the Worship Pastor Escrow Fund. He said that to date, we have received \$32,004, which is possibly enough for a half year's salary. Based on our current circumstances and current needs, we are no longer actively soliciting funds for this position. The monies will be set aside, and if and when our need and circumstances change, will be used then for that purpose.

Pastor Les also reported that under the supervision of the Pastoral Relations Committee and Leadership Team we have updated the six pastoral and support staff job descriptions to meet current ministry needs and expectations. If you are curious, please ask and we'll be happy to share these with you.

He also announced two corrections to the Annual Report -

Page 37 – Harry and Sandy Moore – membership removed at their request

Page 39 – the second Linda Ziegler should be William Ziegler

Follow Up from Last Year's Meeting

Last year we approved the addition of up to 2 members-at-large to the Leadership Team. Neither position has been filled yet.

We approved the addition of the Leader of the Worship Ministry Team to the Leadership Team. This team has not been created yet but we are working toward that.

There has been some confusion about who is what and does what musically –

- Worship Ministry Team Leader volunteer leader of this ministry team
- Music Coordinators Carole Bean and Jann Huggens small salary; they assist staff with Sunday's music selections
- Worship Pastor future position with a salary; may become Worship Ministry Team Leader
- Worship Leaders volunteers who lead worship on Sunday mornings

Votes

Pastor Les explained the first several votes will be by voice. If a vote is too close to determine by voice, a standing vote will occur.

- Change in church fiscal year from Aug 1 -July 31 to Sept 1 -Aug 31. This will eliminate beginning a fiscal year before the annual meeting. It will create a 13-month time period for this year, but will be resolved beginning Sept 1, 2023. MOTION: The LT moved that we shift the fiscal year from "August 1st to the following July 31th to September 1st to the following August 31st. The motion was seconded. There were no comments or questions. The motion passed by a unanimous voice vote.
- Because of the work of the PRC and HR, this MOTION is made: The LT moves that we add the position of Human Resource Ministry Team Chairperson to the Leadership Team. The motion was seconded. There were no comments or questions. The motion passed by a unanimous voice vote.
- To further clarify the work and role of the PRC, the PRC makes this MOTION: that we adopt the LT approved changes to the 2021 bylaws, Article X, to replace the lengthy section added last year with the shorter and more precise content and placing the removed material in the PRC Policy Manual. (Both the shorter bylaw section and the PRC Policy Manual material were available for members to review two weeks before the Annual Meeting.) The motion was seconded; no comments or questions; motion passed with a unanimous voice vote.
- The next motion is included so the bylaw document can be corrected as needed to align with the change from CA to PRC. MOTION: The LT moves that we give the Staff permission to make the necessary changes in the Bylaws to align the whole document with the more recent structural changes – CA to PRC. The motion was seconded; there were no comments or questions; and the motion passed with a unanimous voice vote.
- The last voice vote concerns editorial and minor content changes to our bylaws, as listed in our Annual Report. MOTION: The LT moves that we adopt the editorial and minor

content changes that have been noted in preparation for today's meeting. The motion was seconded; there were no questions or comments; and the motion passed with a unanimous voice vote.

The final two votes were by ballot.

- The first one was for the Slate of Election as presented in the Annual Report. Pastor Les had the tellers pass out these ballots to those seated in the two center sections. Elaine Stein made a motion that we adopt the State of Election as presented. Peg Stuart seconded the motion. There were no comments or questions. Voters were then directed to mark their ballot either "yes" or "no" or to leave it blank to abstain. The tellers collected all the ballots and counted. There were 65 yes votes with one abstention.
- The second vote was to accept the FY 2022-2023 budget. Pastor Les had the tellers pass out these ballots to those seated in the two center sections. After he described how the change in the fiscal year will affect the budget (the budget is created for 12 months but will cover 13 months due to that change, etc.), he called for a motion to adopt the proposed FY 2022-2023 budget. Kevin Patton made the motion; it was seconded by Elaine Stein. The members were directed to mark their ballot either "yes" or "no" or to leave it blank to abstain. The letters collected all the ballots and counted. There were 64 yes votes with two abstentions.

Conclusion

Pastor Les asked if any of the staff or ministry team leaders had anything to add to the reports they presented in the Annual Report. No one did.

He asked the members present if there were any questions or comments on the reports or the information shared at this meeting. There were none.

He then asked for a motion to receive the reports as posted. Motion was made by Bob Stein, seconded by Russ Cook. There were no comments or questions, and the motion passed by a unanimous voice vote.

Pastor Les reported there is no old or unfinished business to process today, and that there is no new business to handle today.

He called for motion to refer the minutes to the LT for approval. The motion was made by Mary Krause, seconded by Earl Geiger. There were no comments or questions, and the motion passed with a unanimous voice vote.

There being no further business, Pastor Les called for a motion to adjourn. Pastor Gary Bosler made that motion, and Frank Larkin seconded the motion. Pastor Les then called for all in favor to rise for closing prayer, which he offered.
